SHOW SITE / Trial Information

- The trial will be run indoors on mats in one 80' x 120' ring.
- Follow Parking Rules and Directions
- Dogs requiring measurement should be measured prior to their first run. Dogs with a wither height of 20" or less will need to be measured unless they have a permanent AKC, NADAC or ASCA height card
- Trial equipment provided by High Goal Farm as follows: Rubberized, slatted A-frame, rubberized Dog walk & teeter – unslatted, wing jumps, non-wing jumps, displaceable tire, tunnels, double jump, weave poles 24" spacing.
- Lunch tickets will be provided for workers. There are several restaurants within a short distance of the fairgrounds with curbside pickup or delivery.

- Be sure to report any damage which may occur.
- Do NOT leave dogs unattended.

DIRECTIONS TO TRIAL SITE

From North and South

Take I-87 (Adirondack Northway) to Exit 14. Follow signs for Schuylerville and Route 29 east. Take Route 29 east through Schuylerville, across the Hudson River and up the hill. Fairgrounds are on the left.

From Western New York

Take I-90 East (NYS Thruway) to Exit 24 (Albany). Take I-87 North (Adirondack Northway) to Exit 14. Follow signs for Schuylerville and Route 29 east. Take Route 29 east through Schuylerville, across the Hudson River and up the hill. Fairgrounds will be on the right.

From East

Take the Mass Turnpike to NYS Thruway. Take the Thruway to Exit B1 (Albany). Follow I 90 to exit 7 (I-787 north). Follow 787 North to exit 7. Follow Route 7 West to intersection of I-87 North to Exit 14 Follow signs for Schuylerville and Route 29 east. Take route 29 East through Schuylerville, across the Hudson River and up the hill. Fairgrounds will be on the left.

NOTICE TO EXHIBITORS

This trial is sanctioned by the Australian Shepherd Club of America, with The Working Australian Shepherd Club of Upstate New York as the sponsor club. Exhibitors, through submission of entry, acknowledge that they are knowledgeable of ASCA rules and regulations, and agree to abide by all rules in effect at the time of this trial.

All healthy, trained dogs over eighteen (18) months of age are eligible to compete in ASCA agility trials. Dogs entering in ANY level of classes do NOT have to have an ASCA registration or QTracking number. Application for QTracking number can be obtained at: www.asca.org/Portals/0/trackapp.pdf. Bitches in heat, lame, or blind dogs are ineligible for entry, as is any dog with a deformity, which may cause a judge to not be able to reasonably assess the dog's ability to function and perform agility obstacles safely, and in a manner that is in the best interest, health and welfare of the dog. Any dog which demonstrates aggression towards any person or any dog, whether inside the ring or outside the ring, must be excused from the agility trial. Any dog which the judge feels is not in enough control to perform all obstacles in a safe manner will be excused from the agility trial.

- ◆ This ASCA agility trials shall be open to purebred and mixed breed dogs.

- ◆ No bitches in heat allowed on grounds. No collars, food, toys, clickers, or other aids or devices shall be permitted on the course or within ten feet of the ring entrance at any time. The only exception to this is leading your dog to the start on lead, and then handing the lead to a steward. All dogs should be on leash or in a crate or pen when not competing. Safety shall always be the foremost consideration in actions and conduct by handlers at all times. The organizing committee may NOT refuse any entry other than on the basis expressly provided through rules and regulations of the sanctioning organization(s). Anyone not currently in good standing with ASCA will not be allowed entry into the trial.

The sponsoring club will not be responsible for the loss or damage to any dog exhibited, or for the possessions of any exhibitor whether the result was by accident or any other cause. It is distinctly understood that every dog at this event is in the care, custody and control of his owner or handler during the entire time the dog is on the show premises. Any exhibitor whose dogs and/or children create unnecessary disturbances or repeatedly engage in unsafe or disruptive behavior may, at the discretion of the Trial/Show Committee, be asked to leave the show site. In such case, no refund of fees paid will be made.

- If you are not feeling well, please stay home. If you have been or think you may have been exposed to COVID 19 or are caring for someone who may have it, please stay home.
- Please be aware of social distancing guidelines. Wear a mask when social distancing is difficult. Masks must be worn while in the building.
- Gloves will be provided by WASCUNY for course builders and ring crew. Hand sanitizer will also be available. Please wash your hands frequently.
- Pre-check in is encouraged so people are not crowding around gate sheets. Please bring your own pen. We will share results on google drive to reduce crowding around the results.
- Leashes: We will NOT be providing a leash runner. All handlers must pocket or carry on their body their own leash. If a leash falls to the ground and a dog grabs it off the ground or on a person's body, that will be considered an 'E' – elimination.

Rule Changes:

Toys in the ring. Toys may be brought in the ring for training purposes. These toys may not involve food or treats of any kind, may not make noise or leave parts behind. All handlers declaring toys will mark the gate sheet with a "T" at the run check in and will run at the end of the jump height. Upon entering the ring, handlers must declare to the judge that they have a toy. They will be immediately eliminated whether or not the toy is used and will have the specific time for training in the ring. If handlers bring a toy in the ring without declaring it, they will be asked to leave immediately.

Transferring points between Championship and ACE Programs: Points from the ACE Program may not be transferred to the Championship Program. Points from any division in the Championship program, may be transferred to the standard Division in the ACE program, provided they have not already been used to obtain an RS-E, RV-E, RJ-E, JV-E, JJ-E, GS-E, GV-E, GJ-E or an ATCH title.

REFUNDS

There shall be no refunds for entries withdrawn in the event a dog and/or handler are dismissed from competition, regardless of the reason for such dismissal. Refunds are allowed if requested before the closing date. Refunds after closing date for bitches in season only. **ALL REQUESTS FOR REFUNDS MUST INCLUDE OWNER'S NAME AND ADDRESS AND VETERINARIAN'S CERTIFICATE.**

MOVE-UPS

After submitting your entry form, the last day that we will be accepting move ups before the trial will be Monday, November 30, 2020. Move-ups will be allowed on Sat. for Sunday's runs. Move up form will be available at the score table.

AWARDS

First through fourth place ribbons will be awarded for each jump height in all classes and levels. Qualifying Rosettes will be awarded for each qualifying run.

JUMP HEIGHTS

Dog's Height	11" & under	14" & under	18" & under	20" & under	Over 20"
CH-Standard jumps at:	8"	12"	16	20	20+" or 24
Vets & Ace Std. jump at:	4	8	12	16	16+
ACE Sr. jumps at:	4"	4"	8"	12"	12+

ASCA height rules allow dog in 20+ category (measuring over 20" at withers) to jump in either the 20+ or 24" jump height class if offered. Veterans must jump 4" lower than the dog's standard jump height and Junior Handlers may jump 4" lower than standard, OR at the dog's standard jump height. Dogs with a wither height of <20" must be measured (or show an approved jump height card) unless they jump in the 20" +/- 24" class. (16" + for veterans, ACE Std.).

CH – STD 8 12 16 20 20+ (jumps 20) 24
JrH may jump at the standard jump height or 4" lower
Vets & Ace 4 8 12 16 16+ (jumps 16)

- ◆ A dog may be entered in a class at a jump height higher than they are eligible provided the dog is not entered in the Veteran Division classes.
- ◆ No dog shall ever jump lower than 4" in the Junior Handler or Veteran Division.
- ◆ 20+ and 24" will be scored and placed together as one class.
- ◆ Refer to the current ASCA rule book for the current Breed Jump Height Exemption List.

IMPORTANT INFORMATION ON ENTRIES

- Entries postmarked before the opening date of Monday, August 17, 2020 - WILL NOT BE ACCEPTED.
There shall be no refunds/credit for entries withdrawn after the closing date, except for a dog's injury and /or illness or for bitches that come in season after the closing date. Requests must be received by the trial secretary prior to the start of the trial. **ALL REQUESTS FOR REFUNDS MUST INCLUDE OWNER'S NAME, ADDRESS AND A VETERINARIAN'S CERTIFICATE.**
There will be no refunds if the trial cannot open or be completed by reason of riots, civil disturbances, fire, act of God, public emergency, strike, or any other cause beyond the control of the event committee. There will be no refund in the event that the dog and/or handler is dismissed from the competition regardless of reason.

Agreement

IMPORTANT LEGAL AGREEMENT—(1) The person signing this Agreement represents being authorized to enter into it on behalf of him/herself, as well as (if different) the owner(s) and handler(s) of the dog(s) for which an entry form is being submitted (all these parties collectively referred to herein as “Applicant”). (2) “Releasees” here collectively refers to the Australian Shepherd Club of America® (ASCA®); its officers and board of directors, staff, contractors, insurers, attorneys, and agents; as well as ASCA®’s affiliate clubs and each of their members, officers, directors, employees, show chairs, show committees, judges, contractors, insurers, and agents. (3) Applicant enters into this Agreement in consideration for being allowed to submit an entry form and, if approved, to take part in related activities of ASCA® and/or its affiliates. (4) Applicant acknowledges entering into this Agreement voluntarily, after the opportunity to obtain independent legal review of it and to have questions about its likely meaning answered through such review. (5) Applicant accepts the terms of this Agreement not only on his/her own behalf but also for his/her successors, assigns, beneficiaries, heirs, parents/guardians, and anyone else who might raise a claim on his/her behalf or as a result of her suffering harm. (6) To the extent any provision or application of this Agreement turns out to be unenforceable, the rest of it still remains fully effective. (7) This Agreement is to be interpreted under Texas law, without application of its choice-of-law rules, and—to the extent permitted by law—any legal action by Applicant that names Releasees as one or more defendants shall be filed and heard solely in the state or federal courts serving the county of ASCA®’s headquarters: Brazos County, Texas. (8) Applicant agrees to abide by the rules and regulations of ASCA® and any other rules and regulations appearing in the premium for this event. (9) Applicant represents that the dog(s) being entered is/are not known to pose a hazard to persons, other dogs, or property and that all required rabies and other vaccinations under the state and local law of the dog’s state of residence are current. (10) Applicant acknowledges awareness of and assumes the risk associated with his/her participation and that of his/her dog(s) in this event and related activities, among which are personal injury to Applicant and those affiliated with Applicant, injury to Applicant’s dog(s), and damage to Applicant’s property. As but a few examples, Applicant and/or his/her dog(s) may be injured from the condition of (or failure to warn of the condition of) floors, stairways, lighting, security measures or a lack of them, electrical devices, fittings, show rings, parking areas, motor vehicles, and unfamiliar animals and people. (11) Applicant releases Releasees from any claim or liability whatsoever arising from any injury, harm, liability, or demand in anyway said to occur during or in connection with related events, also waiving any right to assert such claims that he/she otherwise might have in the absence of this Agreement. (12) Applicant also agrees to indemnify Releasees from any claim that Applicant or those acting on Applicant’s behalf, for Applicant’s benefit, or in Applicant’s place, might assert against Releasees. The obligation in this regard extends even to Applicant’s paying settlements, judgments, and expenses and costs of legal defense incurred by Releasees. (13) The waivers, releases, and promises of indemnification undertaken by Applicant in this Agreement **EXTEND EVEN TO: CLAIMS ASSERTING NEGLIGENCE PER SE, CONDUCT THAT IS INTENTIONAL OR RECKLESS, CLAIMS OF FRAUD, CLAIMS INVOLVING DEATH, ACTIVITY THAT WOULD OVERLAP WITH ALLEGATIONS OF CRIMINALITY, AND/OR CLAIMS SEEKING EXEMPLARY DAMAGES.** They apply without regard to the basis of the claim (e.g., based on tort, breach of contract, common law, implied or express warranty, or otherwise). Applicant’s promised indemnification of Releasees also extends to claims third parties assert against Releasees said to be based on Applicant’s conduct. (14) **INFECTIOUS DISEASE—**Applicant’s promises and assumption of risks in this Agreement also extend to the risk and any asserted harm Applicant and the dog(s) may suffer from actual or threatened exposure to infectious disease, whether COVID-19 or otherwise, and Applicant accepts full responsibility for taking such measures as may be required or prudent to protect Applicant and well as other participants in the events. Applicant represents being aware of related recommend health practices, e.g., masking and distancing. (15) Applicant assigns to ASCA® the sole right to pursue any claim in connection with or arising in relation to the scheduled events that Applicant or those acting for Applicant otherwise might assert against any person or entity affiliated with ASCA®. (16) There are no provisions to this Agreement other than as spelled out here and they may not be modified except by formal ASCA® board action. This Agreement is to be interpreted to provide Releasees with the maximum protection from liability allowable under the law.
